## **ATTENDANCE UPDATE**

This year we have made real progress in improving our attendance and are pleased to see so many of our children in school, on time, every day. It is so important that the children do not miss important parts of their education and we are also keen that they do not miss out on all of the exciting activities that teachers have planned. We have managed to reduce our persistent absentees (children with attendance below 90%) this year and hope to be able to continue to work with you on reducing numbers even further!

Congratulations to the children who have managed to achieve 100% attendance this year! They will be receiving their certificate in next week's Prize Giving Assembly.

As you know if your child misses school they miss learning and significant periods of absence mean that your child will have gaps in their learning journey which become increasingly difficult to fill making it difficult for them to make progress and reach their potential.

All holiday absences are recorded as unauthorised and if families decided to take term time holidays then fines will be issued by the local authority. We strongly advise that you do not book term time holidays and risk your child having gaps in their learning. Many parents this year have reported that grandparents or other family members have booked holidays on their behalf unaware of the term dates- please be aware these holidays will still be unauthorised and fines will be issued.

We have recently been informed that the fine for taking children out of school for a term-time holiday will increase to £160 per parent per child if paid within 28 days, reduced to £80 if paid within 21 days. A further fine, within 3 years, will be charged at the higher rate and there will be a limit of 2 fines before prosecution and further legal action may be taken by the government.

There has also been a decrease in the number of children who are arriving late to school which is good news. If you are struggling to get your child to school on time each day please do speak to Mrs Tilson who will be able to offer support and advice. Remember the school doors are open from 8:30am or 8.40am and the breakfast club is open from 7:30am everyday.
