**REMINDER: TERM TIME HOLIDAYS** 

As you are aware it is very important that your child is at school whenever they are well enough to be here so that they have the opportunity to reach their full potential.

We strongly advise parents and carers not to book holidays in term time and further to this we made the decision to fine parents who take term time holidays when there are no exceptional circumstances.

Please come to see a member of staff if you are planning a term time holiday so that we can discuss it.

I do realise that the cost of holidays are increased, often significantly, during school holidays and the cheaper prices are usually the attraction for taking a term time holiday. However it is very difficult to catch your child back up with the learning that they miss when absent.

All holidays will be unauthorised and the fines for taking a holiday of 5 school days or more in one school year is £60 per child. We are encouraging children to be 'In school, on time, every day.'
